

## YEAR 12 RETREAT RESPECT AND RESPONSIBILITY



The success of the Retreat depends on everyone participating actively and positively to their potential. For this reason it is considered important enough to take time away from the College.

Because we will be living there in a close community, it is important that we respect the rights, feelings, needs and privacy of others. Before we go on retreat, we thought it appropriate to provide formal guidelines to help ensure that **everyone's** needs are met.

Please read the following:

1. We must treat the venue as if it were our own shared resource. (eg. *No noisy activities in the Dormitory Block*).

All students will be asked to check their room upon arrival to ensure that there is no damage. If there is damage evident, students must report this to staff.

### **Consequences**

***In the case of damage, accidental or otherwise, the offender(s) will be asked to pay the cost of repair or replacement. In the event of no clear defaulter, the group will be levied.***

2. We must follow directions of the management (eg. do not remove any of the furnishings from any room at any time especially pillows and blankets). Behind the dormitories where the equipment is kept, is out of bounds. Smoking is prohibited. Alcohol consumption is prohibited.
3. Do not bring any drugs (recreational {alcohol, cigarettes etc.} or otherwise) to the retreat.

### **Consequences**

***Suspension will be immediate and you will leave the retreat.***

4. Your whereabouts is to be known by College staff at all times. In case of emergency, we may need to find you quickly (ie. you spend the whole night in the room you have been allocated). Do not wander around the grounds without permission.
5. You must respect the privacy and modesty of others.
  - (a) No one is to go into any other bedroom apart from the one to which they have been assigned.
