

Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE)

QCE requirements



20 credits from contributing courses of study, including:

- QCAA-developed subjects or courses
- vocational education and training (VET) qualifications
- non-Queensland studies
- recognised studies.



12 credits from completed Core courses of study and 8 credits from any combination of:

- Core
- Preparatory (maximum 4)
- Complementary (maximum 8).



Satisfactory completion, grade of C or better, competency or qualification completion, pass or equivalent.



Students must meet literacy and numeracy requirements through one of the available learning options.

The Queensland Certificate of Education is the state education qualification and St Joseph's College expects all students to be working towards the attainment of their QCE.

AARA

Some common AARA include:

- providing **alternative exam conditions**, e.g. extra time, rest breaks and/or separate venues
- providing alternative-format papers, e.g. A4 to A3 enlargement, black-andwhite materials
- providing assistive technology, e.g. screen reader and speech recognition application, magnification application
- providing a reader and/or scribe
- making illness and misadventure arrangements for examinations.





The ATAR has replaced the OP







What is an ATAR?

Primary mechanism used nationally for tertiary admissions ATAR is not a grade, it is a rank

Indicates a student's position relative to other students

2,000 point scale from 99.95 down to 0.00 ATARs less than 30.00 will be expressed as "30 and below"

How is the ATAR determined?



QCAA provides
QTAC with students'
subject results
(Units 3 and 4 only)
and completed VET
qualifications.



For each student:
The best five scaled subject results (from eligible inputs) are added together to create a Best five Subject Aggregate.



QTAC determines how many students are to be in each of the 2000 ATAR bands

(based on the Queensland Year 12 population using a nationally-agreed process). For example, if the Queensland Year 12 population is 60,000 students then 30 students will be placed in each of the 2000 ATAR bands (i.e. 60,000 divided by 2000 ATAR bands = 30 students in each band)

QTAC undertakes the inter-subject scaling process using all Unit 3 and 4 subject results & completed VET qualifications.

Scaling – Overview

Scaling is necessary so that student results in different subjects can be compared <u>fairly</u>.

- If a student of a given ability studies a less challenging Mathematics subject they might get 90 / 100.
- But if the same student studied a more challenging Maths subject they might only get 80 / 100.

However, if scaling works, they should end up with the same scaled score for inclusion in their ATAR.

How will VET be included in ATAR

- St Joseph's Certificate III or higher
 - Each VET qualification level will have a single scaled score that can be included in the student's ATAR

 Certificate III Business and Certificate III Sport and Recreation will have the same scaled score.

 A scaled score for a VET diploma will be higher than a Certificate IV, which in turn will be higher than a Certificate III.
