Social climate

Biannually St Joseph's College engages in data gathering from parents, staff and students to assist it in evaluating the effectiveness of its educational program.

Description of how non-attendance of students is managed by the school

Rolls are marked at the beginning of every lesson. Absences which are noted by teaching staff at roll call are reported to the College Office. Office staff, using the noted contact numbers, contact parents using SMS/message software seeking a response explanation of the student's absence. The St Joseph's College Office staff, Joey's Way (Pastoral Care) Teacher, and Student Engagement Team (Pastoral Leader) monitor levels of absence, and should absences become

an issue, a meeting with the Student Engagement Team (Pastoral House Leader), Program Leader for Junior or Senior Schooling or Assistant Principal – Student Engagement is arranged to discuss the matter.

Next Step 2022 Post-School Destinations

St Joseph's College — Toowoomba



This is a summary of the post-school destinations of students from St Joseph's College — Toowoomba who completed Year 12 and gained a Senior Statement in 2021. The results are from the *Year 12 Completers Survey*, which is conducted approximately six months after students completed Year 12.

75.9% response rate

82 out of 108 Year 12 completers from this school responded to the 2022 survey. Results may not be representative of all Year 12 completers at this school.

Post-school destinations



In 2022, 96.3% of Year 12 completers from St Joseph's College — Toowoomba were engaged in education, training or employment in the year after they completed school.



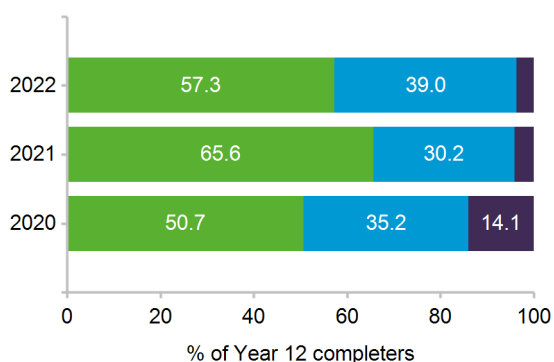
Of the 82 respondents, 57.3% continued in some recognised form of education and training. The most common study destination was bachelor degree.



A further 39.0% transitioned directly into paid employment and no further study.

All Year 12 completers were assigned to a *main destination*. Respondents who were both studying and working are reported as being in education or training, including apprentices and trainees.
