Our students leave the College knowing how to make a difference in their community. They aspire to live our College motto of 'Serve Him in Others'.




Student Engagement at St Joseph's College is the foundation for all great learning. All staff at St Joseph's College work in partnership with families and the broader community to ensure students are; attending school, safe at school, connected and respected members of the community and aspiring to excellence in their learning. Student Engagement at St Joseph's is characterised by two priorities: Relational Pedagogy and Joey's Way.

Relational Pedagogy

Staff at St Joseph's College aspire to a Relational Pedagogy. This is a system of high expectations and high support for all students. As well as the liturgical aspects of the Religious Life of St Joseph's College, Relational Pedagogy provides community members with an experience of Jesus' vision for humanity as embodied by blessed Edmund Rice. High quality relational pedagogy is made up of the following practices:

- Providing students with extremely clear but non-threatening expectations.
- Relentlessly expressing care for all students.
- Challenging all students to learn and grow.
- Supporting students through challenges.
- · Celebrating student successes.
- Managing indiscretions restoratively.
- Expanding possibilities for students.

Staff of St Joseph's College utilise *The Joey's Way* framework as the model of Relational Pedagogy to which we aspire.



The Career Development Framework is a developmental approach to career education. Career development is a journey, as economic conditions change, our young people will engage in lifelong learning and will change careers throughout their lives many times. To empower our young people to adapt to the everchanging world of work, the St Joseph's College Career Development Framework focuses on ensuring our students can make informed career decisions, develop career goals and manage their future career pathways. Middle Years

In the Middle Years, students encounter choice and challenge. They are exposed to a full range of core-based subjects and elective opportunities. Students can develop the problem-solving skills and critical thinking skills required to transform into successful learners. The progressive scope of our curriculum is at the forefront of innovation and will create your child's best future.

Years 7 & 8

The Middle School Curriculum spans four years of learning commencing in Year 7 and is based on the Australian Curriculum.

The following core subjects underpin our curriculum:

Years 9 & 10

During these important foundational years, students are able to select four semester electives over the two years to develop their skills. These electives come from the elective subjects they have experienced in Year 7 and 8.

Opportunities for students to participate in English Extension and Mathematics Extension are also offered at the College.

Senior Years

Years 11 and 12 signify a critical time in a student's educational journey at St Joseph's College. Our focus is on developing students as independent learners and active participants in their learning so they are prepared academically, socially and emotionally once they leave school. The combination of extensive choice in career pathways and a genuine desire for student wellbeing ensures our senior students leave as resilient, well-prepared and confident young adults. The Senior Curriculum offers over 34 QCE subjects, based on the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA) syllabus, to work towards optimising the students post school opportunities.

The Senior curriculum offers 24 General and 10 Applied ATAR subjects, six certificate courses and is recognised as a leader in Vocational Education Training (VET), as well as providing opportunities for students to undertake School-Based Apprenticeships or traineeships.
